short synops(is)

KATIE, a young Asian American university student, is seemingly favored by one of her professors for reasons other than her high-quality schoolwork. As this professor extends unwanted, suggestive attention about her looks, Katie grapples with what it means to be the only woman of color in her white, male-dominated filmmaker cohort. The story is based on real events.

summa(ry)

Film School.

KATIE is the only Asian American & woman of color among the first years in her white, male-dominated filmmaker cohort. While she excels in her classes, Katie finds that her professor GRAHAM seemingly favors her for reasons other than her high-quality schoolwork.

After her laptop crashes, Katie visits Graham at his office hours. She finds herself caught one-on-one with him as he attempts to give her tech help. Second-year student NORAH, also Asian American, comes to her rescue and warns Katie that Graham always picks a favorite girl in each class, “You don’t want to be his favorite.”

Norah’s cautionary advice proves sound, when Graham corners Katie at a school event and whispers suggestively that he likes the way she looks.

Katie confides in her best friend, ABBY, who encourages her to tell someone who can do something. She approaches her only female professor JACQUELINE, who commits a microaggression, mistaking a detail about Norah with Katie.

Katie chooses not to confide in Jacqueline.

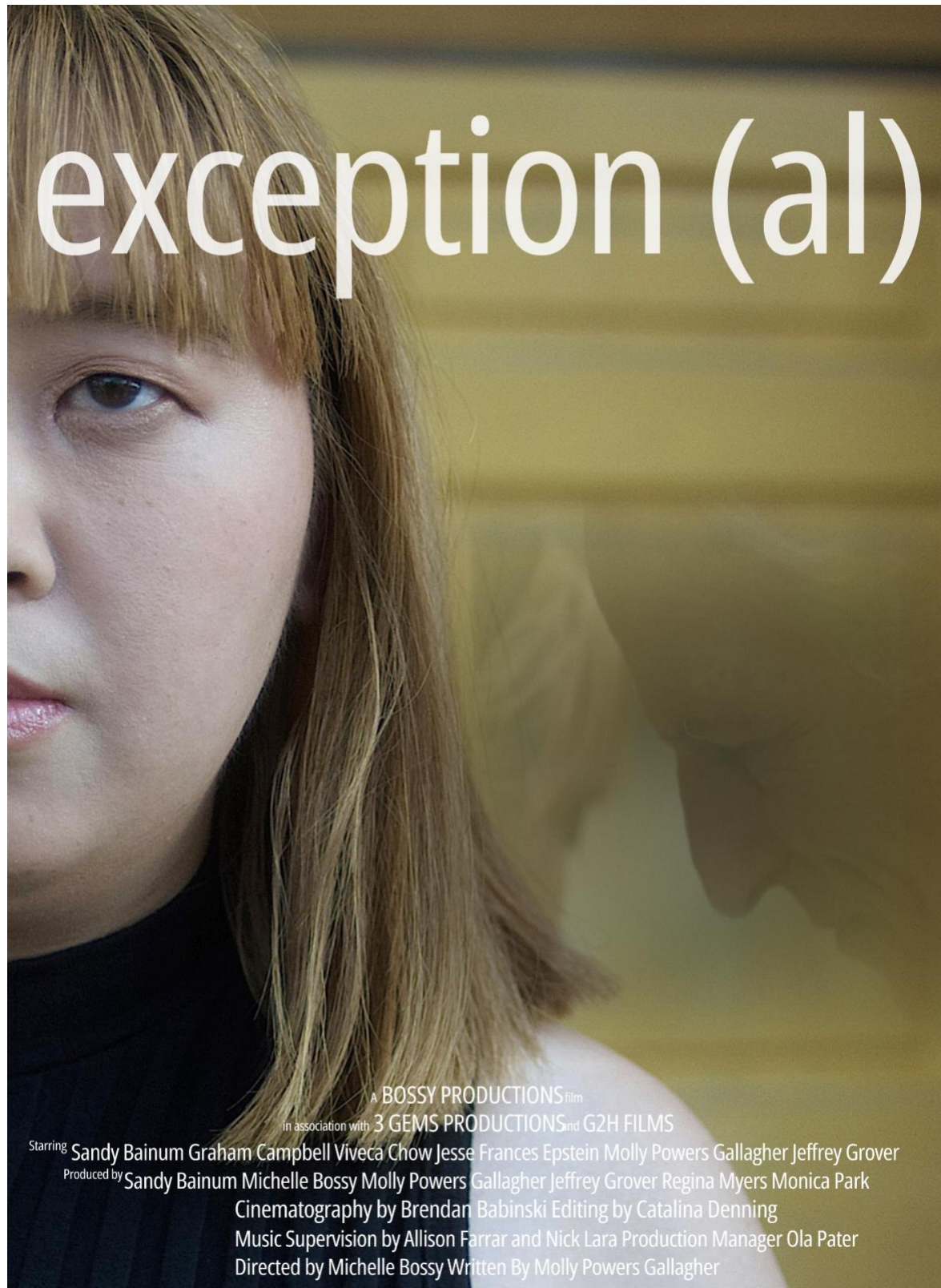

director's statement

EXCEPTION(AL) is a drama set in the treacherous waters of film school. Molly Powers Gallagher (writer/producer/lead) draws from her own personal experiences as a young woman of color in an old boys' club where aggressions are micro and macro. I felt a symbiosis with the script as I too have often found myself to be the only minority woman in traditionally white/male spaces, which becomes especially complicated when trying to find your voice as an artist. EXCEPTION(AL) asks questions about power, privilege and allyship, finding strength in defying the devils you see coming and the dangers who are more subversive.

writer's statement

I was the only Asian American woman & woman of color in my MFA film program. Looking back on my tenure in grad school, it is clear to me where I fell through the gaps because I was the only person in the room who looked like me. EXCEPTION(AL) explores the specific tension that many women of color face in traditionally white, male spaces – being treated as the “exception,” while feeling the pressure to be “exceptional” because you were lucky enough to beat the odds to make it there, even if you are inherently exceptional at what you do and who you are. Our film examines the intersection of gender, age, and race in academia, and ultimately celebrates a new generation of voices that can and will emerge from the breakdown of old systems.

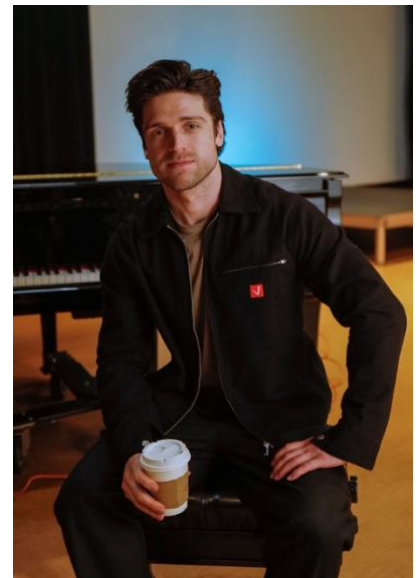

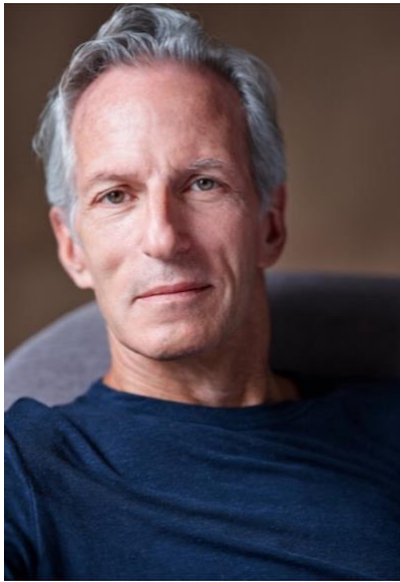

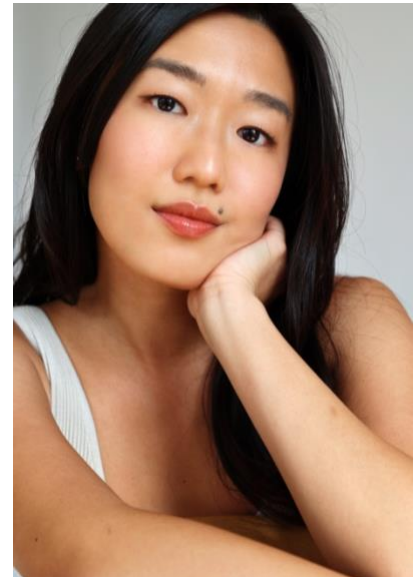
