THE STORY

What We Build blends the past with the present in this multi-generational family story. Alex keeps his life in New York with his boyfriend separate from his family in New Jersey, but when a betrayal forces him to move back in with his parents, he finds himself lost and restless. As fate would have it, his mother enlists him on a mission to bring back his impulsive sister Sofia from Italy. Alex seizes the opportunity to escape and sets off on an adventure that changes his life forever.

It doesn't take long for Italy- and his sister- to start working their magic on him. As the siblings learn the story of their Egyptian father, Farid, and Italian-American mother, Pat, meeting in Florence forty years prior and the long-distance love letters their parents wrote each other, Alex finds himself opening up and questioning old ideas. But when Dave, their older brother, joins them, and Sofia's current obsession, Fabrizio, returns, Alex struggles with his place in this new dynamic.

After a blowout fight, a family emergency brings the siblings back home, where long standing issues are finally addressed. They all struggle to forgive and rebuild, and Alex realizes the ultimate choice is to love.





Artist's Statement and Bio: Peter Sabri (co-writer)

From as early as I can remember, I grew up with the story of how my parents met. It would always be accompanied with someone saying, "it sounds like a movie" which always struck me because our lives felt so ordinary. One of three children, we were raised by hard working parents, in a middle-income household in suburban NJ. There was a lot of love, but it certainly wasn't the fairytale their courtship seemed to be. I wanted to tell their history while framing it with a contemporary story of the family they built together. With over twenty years of friendship, and a rich history of collaboration Sue-Kate was the perfect partner in this. She knew the voices of these characters as well as I did, and we shared a shorthand that often left us finishing each others sentences.

Peter Sabri started in NY in theater where he graduated from NYU's Tisch School of the Arts. Among his many credits there he had the incredible fortune of reviving the two hander *Visiting Mr.Green* starring opposite legendary actor Eli Wallach. Since moving to LA he's continued to work in theater while branching out more into film and television (*Warnings, Live By Night, Grey's Anatomy*). His writing began with his one man piece *Sounds of Silence* premiering at *ARULA*'s inaugural performance post 2016 election featured in the L.A. Times. He most recently co-wrote, produced, and starred in the short *Early Retirement* which serves as a calling card for this feature *What We Build*.




