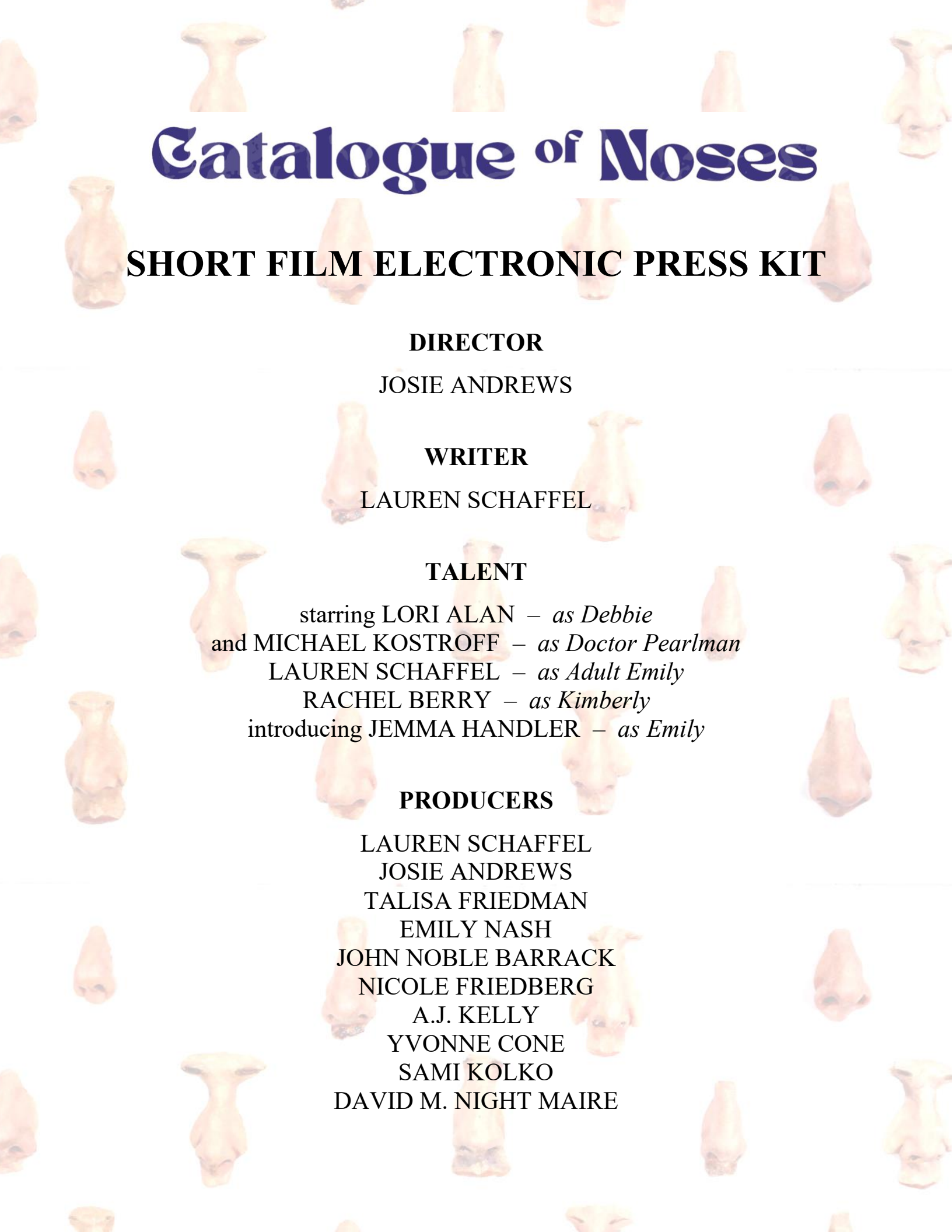

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INTRODUCTION

“Catalogue of Noses” is a short musical comedy film with ‘Fiddler on the Roof’ parody songs that illustrate the sacrifices Jewish women make to assimilate. Inspired by Writer/Producer Lauren Schaffel's own life story of growing up as a child actor in Hollywood and getting a nose job at sixteen.

MISSION STATEMENT

“Catalogue of Noses” combats the harmful portrayal of Jews in media that still exists today, and which is built on centuries of underlying antisemitism. Since the antidote to hate is comedy, we’re telling a story that pokes fun at Western beauty standards and Jewish stereotypes with an educational twist.

We are proud to partner with Reboot Studios on an educational curriculum for “Catalogue of Noses.” Designed to accompany the film, this guide supports our mission to spark meaningful dialogue and deepen understanding of its central themes — including the pressures of assimilation, the origins and impact of the Jewish-nose stereotype, as well as the persistence of antisemitism in contemporary media.

Our goal is to bring this program to Jewish and non-Jewish communities in cities where we’re screening the film, including schools, museums, and religious organizations. The target audience is middle school age and up, including college students and adults.

About Reboot: Reboot is an arts and culture non-profit that reimagines and reinforces Jewish thought and traditions, offering an inviting mix of discovery, experience and reflection.

About the Lesson Plan: The “Catalogue of Noses” companion curriculum is a guided educational tool for teachers, group leaders, and individuals looking to engage further with the themes of the film. Through private reflection, group discussion, and a creative exercise, students will be introduced to key terms and cultural context, the origin of the “Jewish nose” stereotype, and the history of rhinoplasty as they relate to the central question of the film: What are the costs and benefits of assimilation? The lesson plan is designed to take one class period; educators may adjust the length to fit their curriculum. This lesson plan is designed to accompany High School Education through adults and is most suitable for students over the age of 12.

ABOUT THE PRODUCTION

“Catalogue of Noses” has been in the works since Summer 2022. The script was originally commissioned and workshopped as a play for the LA-based theater company JewFace under ShPIeL Performing Identity and was part of their inaugural Short Play Development Lab in Fall 2023. Fueled by the positive reception from the JewFace public reading, the script was adapted into a short film to share the story with a wider audience.

In Spring 2024, the “Catalogue of Noses” screenplay was selected as a semifinalist for the Reboot Studios Grant, which has produced several award-winning Jewish comedies, including Alex Edelman's solo show Just For Us and the short film The Anne Frank Gift Shop.

In Summer 2024, the Jewish Plays Project recognized the “Catalogue of Noses” play script as Commended Status, part of a select group of plays read and discussed thoroughly by a team of theatre professionals.

“Catalogue of Noses” is TRIPLE F-rated with a woman director, writer, and principal actor.

“Catalogue of Noses” was shot on location in Glendale, Los Angeles County, California over the course of 3 days.

“Catalogue of Noses” raised most of its budget through a successful Seed&Spark crowdfunding campaign, with over \$20,000 in pledged donations in support.

“Catalogue of Noses” is an accredited signatory production under the SAG-AFTRA Short Film Agreement.

“Catalogue of Noses” is the second collaboration between Lauren Schaffel and David M. Night Maire after the short grounded sci-fi “Launch at Paradise”.

WRITERS' STATEMENT

I grew up as a child actor in Los Angeles and starred in many primetime comedies like Will and Grace, Still Standing, and several Peanuts films and series (as the voice of Lucy). My dream was to be a series regular on a sitcom, but most of the roles I auditioned for were things like “Freak Girl Number 2” and “Nerdy Little Rascal.” Exactly what every little girl dreams of being, right? I kept being told that my BIG Jewish nose was holding me back...

I wrote “Catalogue of Noses” to combat 'Jewface'— the harmful, inauthentic portrayal of Jews in entertainment including the stereotypes of a large nose prosthetic and an affected Yiddish accent. These stereotypes still exist in Hollywood today and are built on centuries of underlying antisemitism. Since the antidote to hate is comedy, I set out to tell a film that pokes fun at beauty standards and Jewish stereotypes with an educational twist.

Having been a child actor in Hollywood, I’ve faced the pressures of having to change my appearance (specifically my nose) to achieve American beauty standards. These ideas have become more topical with celebrities like Sarah Silverman speaking out about a more recent definition of "Jewface" in the casting of non-Jewish performers to play Jewish characters. On her podcast, Sarah Silverman speaks openly about some recent examples of Jewface, including Bradley Cooper and Helen Mirren wearing large prosthetic noses to portray Leonard Bernstein and Golda Meir, respectively, Rachel Brosnahan in The Marvelous Mrs. Maisel adopting a 'Jewish-sounding' dialect, and Kathryn Hahn (not Jewish) being cast to play Joan Rivers.

I'm proud to be working with a team of predominantly Jewish women in front of and behind the camera to tell this timely and relatable story. This film is for Jewish women who have made sacrifices to assimilate into western culture, whether they've undergone surgery to make their nose appear more gentile, or as in the story of Fiddler on the Roof, given up traditions and religious practices as a means of survival.

Yet, this story is not unique to Jews! We live in a world where pressures to assimilate have increased for people of all backgrounds, especially with our reliance on social media constantly demonstrating unattainable standards of beauty. Turn on Instagram and you'll see a variety of filters available to “touch up” one’s appearance, including the infamous “nose filter” to alter the size of your nose, as well as enhancing one’s eyes, lips, and body. My goal is to shed light on the universality of the need to seek acceptance and achieve unrealistic beauty standards as a means of survival and acceptance.

Lauren Schaffel is an actor, writer, comedian, and singer and has been acting professionally since she was five years old. Her television credits include The Marvelous Mrs. Maisel, Will and Grace, Still Standing, and the voice of Lucy in A Charlie Brown Valentine's Day. In film, she has appeared in My Dead Boyfriend, Admission, and Revenge of the Green Dragons. She's worked at numerous theaters, most recently at the Road Theatre in North Hollywood, and others including Geva in Rochester, several NY theaters including The National Yiddish Theatre Folksbiene, Playwrights Horizons, The Barrow Group, and Urban Stages. Lauren is a recent graduate of the Improv and Writing Lab tracks at the Groundlings School and currently studies and performs at Upright Citizens Brigade. As a filmmaker, she wrote, produced, and starred in the upcoming short, musical comedy film Catalogue of Noses. She also recently wrote and starred in two comedy shorts "Gentle Parenting" and "Steak Dinner," incorporating her original characters created at the Groundlings. Both are currently making the festival circuit. Lauren is a co-founder of the production company LMC Productions, which supports new script development focusing on amplifying female voices. She's also on the board of Jewface Theater Company based in LA, which produced the play version of Catalogue of Noses in their inaugural short play lab development in 2023.

Josie Andrews began performing professionally at the age of eight, touring with Broadway musicals and appearing in countless Off-Broadway and regional productions before going on to write and record her own music. By thirteen, she was opening for Radio Disney acts including Raven Symoné and the Naked Brothers Band. A double Trojan, Josie graduated as the Salutatorian of USC's class of 2018, continuing at USC to earn her M.F.A. in production. Her thesis film WANNABE, which she wrote, directed, and created original music for, debuted at LA Shorts, garnering many wins and nominations across the globe including Nashville Film Festival, Arizona Film Festival, Melech Tel Aviv, and Sydney Women's International Film Festival. Her debut documentary tracking live theatre's comeback amidst the Covid-19 pandemic, WAITING IN THE WINGS, played Santa Fe International Film Festival, won best doc at Noho Cinefest, and can now be seen on the PBS app through their Fine Cut series. Now an adjunct professor at USC, she teaches a producing/development course and heads Dumm Blonde Productions, where she recently completed a short starring Sidney Flanigan (Never Rarely Sometimes Always) and Academy Award® Nominee Cathy Moriarty (Raging Bull) titled LINE OF FIRE. She is slated to make her feature directorial debut with MIRIAM, one of five projects selected for WIF/Sundance finance intensive, as well as the AWD Rising Director fellowship.

Lori Alan, actor/writer/producer, started talking as soon as she fell out of the womb, and hasn't stopped since. A native of the Washington, DC area, her passion for entertaining led the five-year-old actress to make her television debut as the star of a Shakey's Pizza commercial. She went on to graduate with honors from NYU's Tisch School of the Arts and set off cutting her teeth on the comedy circuit, as a longtime member of New York's Gotham City Improv (Groundlings East). Lori is perhaps best known for her award-winning voice-over work, which was honored at the First Annual Voice Arts Awards (the Academy Awards for Voice-Overs) with first-place prizes for Outstanding Body of Work and Outstanding National Television Commercial. She starred as Diane Simmons on Family Guy, Pearl the Whale on SpongeBob: Squarepants, Sue Richards, The Invisible Woman, on Marvel Comics' The Fantastic Four, and The Boss in the Metal Gear Solid video game trilogy. She's proud to be a part of the Pixar Family, voicing characters in Wall-e, Monster's University, Bonnie's Mom in Pixar's Toy Story 3, Despicable Me, Minions, and Mother's Sadness in Inside Out. 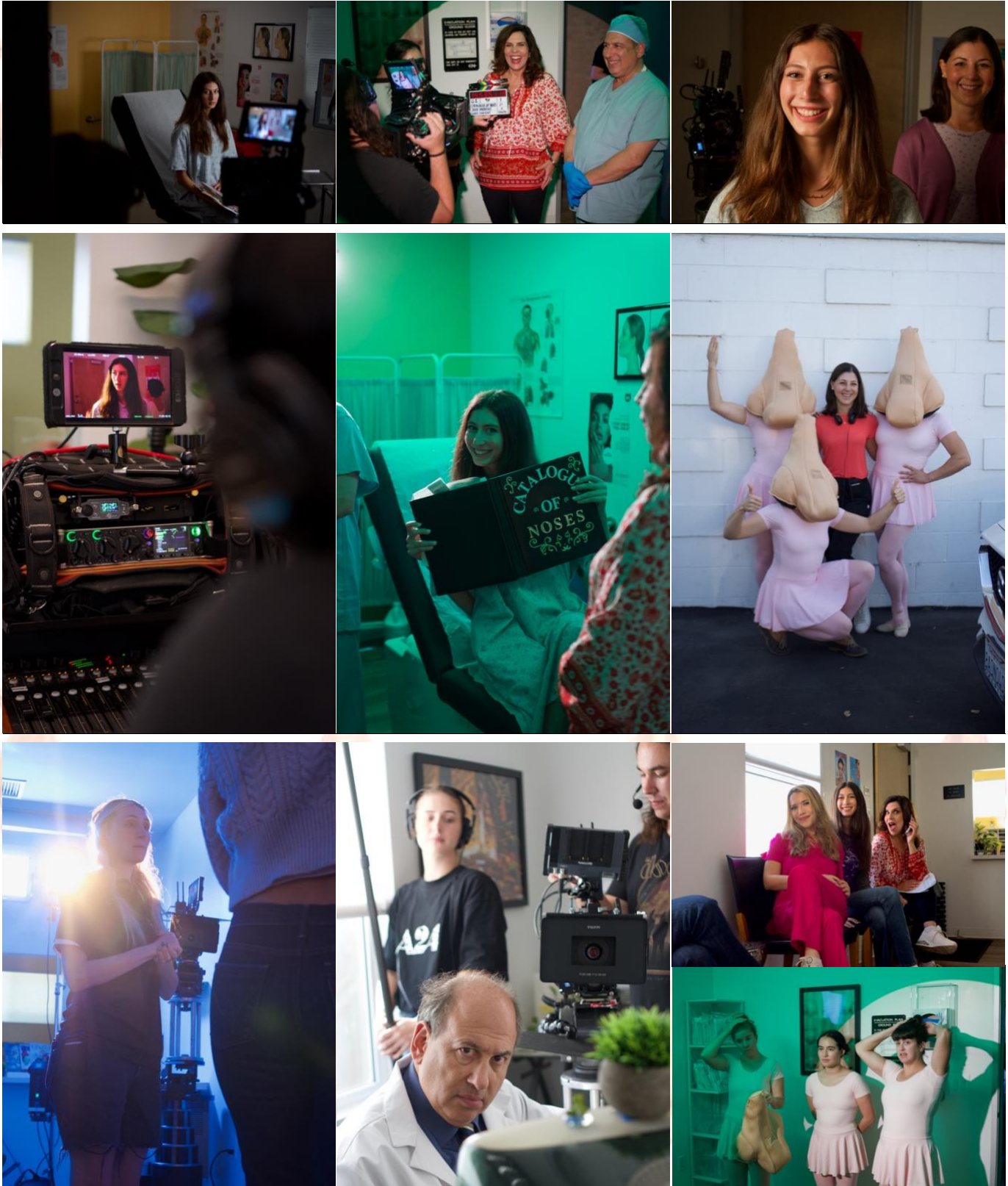
