LOG LINE

In a dystopian society, Mariam, like all citizens, receives a government call precisely 24 hours before her predetermined death informing her of her final day.

SHORT SYNOPSIS

Set in a dystopian near-future wherein everyone receives a 24-hour government warning prior to their death, Mariam receives a call from Bob, a real-life operator starting his first day on the job, informing her of her final day.

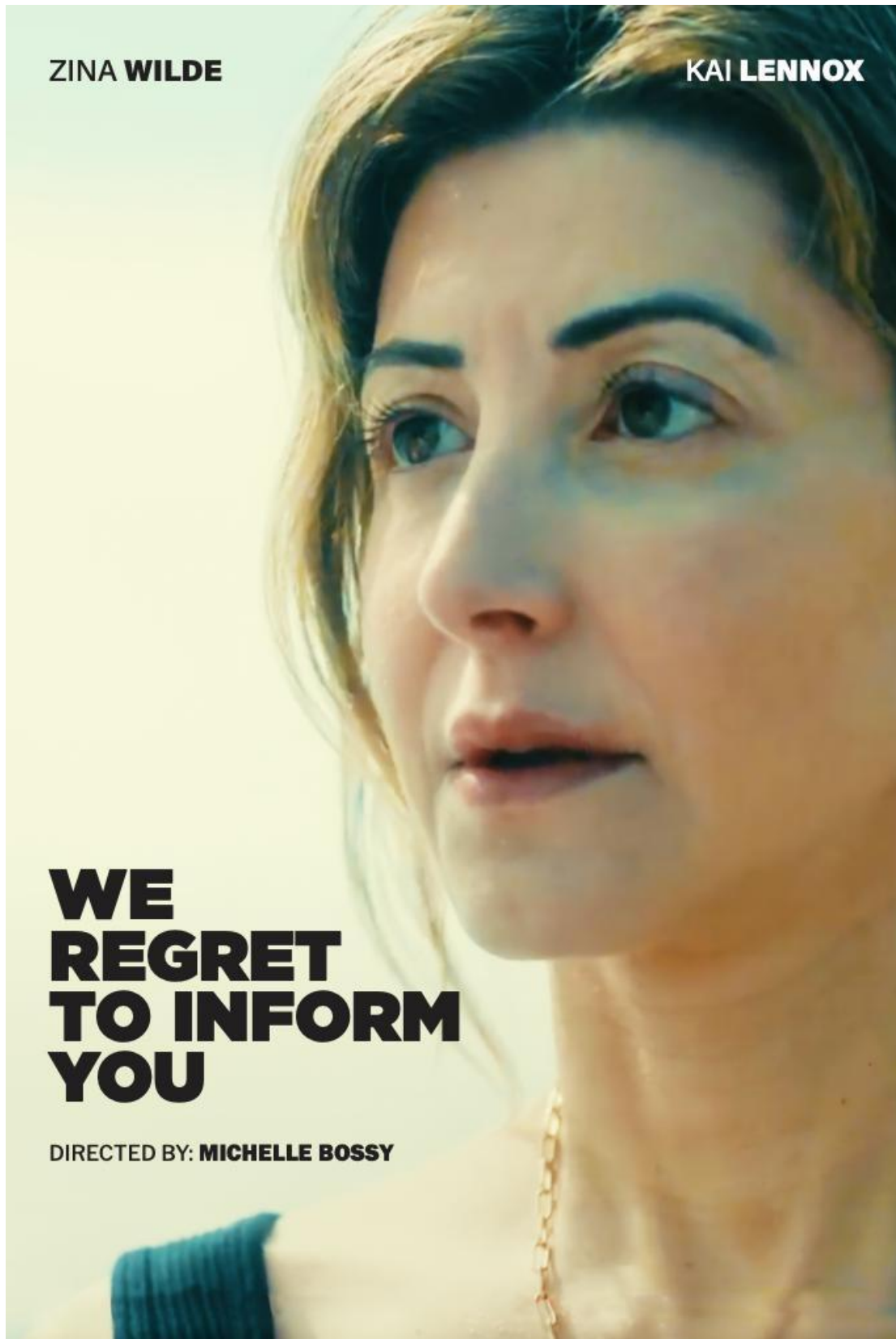
LONG SYNOPSIS

Set in a dehumanized society of the near future, technology has replaced nearly all human interaction, isolating people under the guise of 'optimization.' In this setting, the government provides 'last day notification' services wherein all citizens are contacted with a 24-hour courtesy call warning them of their impending death. Precisely one day before her predetermined passing, Mariam receives such a call from Bob, a real-life operator that is on his first day on the job, informing her of her final day.

ABOUT THE PRODUCTION

“We Regret to Inform You” is a proof-of-concept for an hour-long TV series of 10 episodes.

“We Regret to Inform You” is TRIPLE F-rated with a woman director, writer, and principal actor.

Writer-Producer-Actor Zina Wilde and Director-Producer Michelle Bossy were introduced by Wilde’s “Billions” (2016) cast mate Stephen Kunken, whom Bossy later directed in the short film “Miracle Baby” (2020).

Writer-Producer-Actor Zina Wilde and Director-Producer Michelle Bossy were temporary roommates when Zina first moved to LA; they are both bicoastal!

“We Regret to Inform You” was shot on location in Santa Monica, Los Angeles County, California over 2 days.

“We Regret to Inform You” is an accredited signatory production under the SAG-AFTRA Short Film Agreement.

Writer-Producer-Actor Zina Wilde and Director-Producer Michelle Bossy are actively collaborating on several other projects that they are excited to share soon!

“We Regret to Inform You” marks the fourth short film collaboration between Director-Producer Michelle Bossy and Producer David M. Night Maire!

DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

“We Regret to Inform You” is a dystopian short film, set in the near future where citizens are given the unfortunate news of their impending death hours before it happens. It’s Black Mirror-esque in its premise. Mariam, our protagonist, works with her representative Bob to uncover the cause of death, which ends up being a broken heart. I was drawn to this film because of its intersection of dramedy, political commentary, and heart. It’s a universal thought: what would I do if I knew I had one last day on earth? Would I make the most of it, would I fight the inevitable, would I mourn the loss?

Jack Schurman, our Director of Photography, and I used sunlight flares to bring the outside into Bob’s cramped office and match the connection between Mariam’s and his experience. We also wanted to foreshadow the “glow” that Mariam leaves in, at the end of the film. The setting of the film is juxtaposed with the internal devastation the characters are experiencing. The perfect Los Angeles weather, verdant Larchmont streets, and the sunny beaches of Santa Monica compete with the cramped, sad makeshift laundry room office Bob works from. Sharon van Etten’s song “Peace Signs”, found for us by our music supervisor Livy Behar-Rodriguez, signals that Mariam has finally reconciled the loss she experienced.

Being a small cast, the film hinges on the performances. Kai Lennox as Bob is funny and sad: a disheveled but soft-hearted new worker struggling to get through his first call. We hope for him to succeed, but also don’t want him to because a measure of success is getting off the phone with Mariam. Kai finds a great tension in playing those opposites. Zina Wilde draws on her Greek roots to find mythology in her script and in transformation at the end of the film. She rides an incredible wave of emotion in the film.

As someone who has lived her fair share of heartbreak, including a devastating break up that brought me to LA, I identified with Zina’s script from the moment I read it. We see Mariam go through the stages of grief during her call with Bob. Bob is in a period of mourning, too. He goes from a floundering call center agent to an empathetic partner in crime, helping Mariam navigate the treacherous new waters of imminent death. The ending is intentionally ambiguous: does Mariam become a deity, does she defy the odds or does her life end? It’s in the eye of the beholder.

Zina Wilde (a.k.a. Eu Zina, and Zina Anaplioti) was born in 1980 in London, England, U.K. and raised in Thessaloniki, Greece. In Ancient Greek the ‘eu zin’ means the good life, and she’s all about it. At the ripe age of 18, Zina moved to New York City where she studied acting at New York University: Tisch School of the Arts. Upon graduation, and after more acting school, she finally started working as an actress as well as a waitress (but mostly a waitress). Many many moons later, she finally landed a gig that changed her life; she was cast as Helena in the prestigious Showtime series ‘Billions’ (2016) with Paul Giamatti and Damian Lewis. She worked on the show for 5 seasons and loved every minute of it. Since then, this actress and writer has worked on many movies and TV shows. Most recently I worked with Jane Fonda, Rita Moreno and Lilly Tomlin in the Paramount+ film ‘80 for Brady.’ Yup, Tom Brady was in it too. Zina has also become known for her feature film work on Sony Picture Classic’s ‘The Climb’ (2019), and IFC Films’ ‘Chuck’ (2016), as well as for her television work on ABC’s ‘Madoff’ (2016) and NBC’s ‘Blacklist’ (2014).
